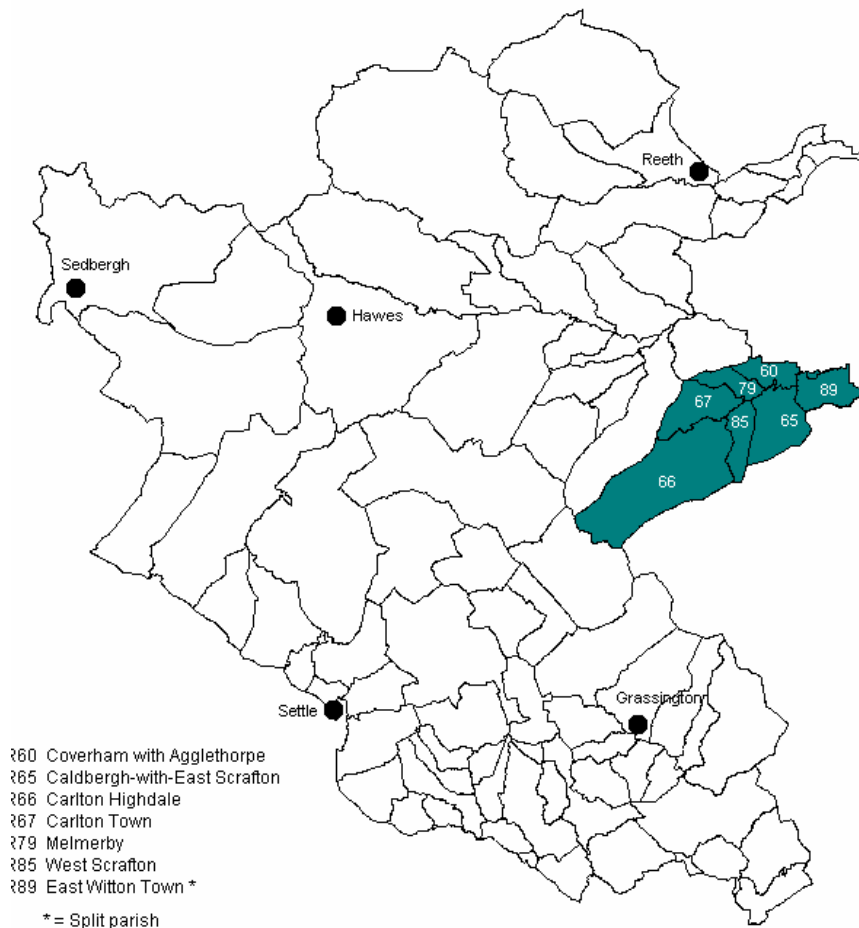




COVERDALE **CENSUS PROFILE 1991-2001**

Notes

1. Figures may not sum due to independent rounding and adjustments to preserve confidentiality.
2. Any parish that falls below the confidentiality threshold for Small Area Statistics data is merged with a contiguous parish. (Confidentiality threshold in 1991 was 50 persons/20 households, in 2001 the threshold was 100 persons/40 households).
3. Where parishes are split by the National Park boundary and/or combined with others outside the boundary, an estimate has been made of the percentage in the Park.

Summary

Significant increase in population

Increased population across all 3 age groups

increase in households is entirely due to net additional couple or multi-adult households

Strong growth in outright ownership. Decline in rental sector.

No change in numbers economically active despite increase in population of working age.

Strong representation in agriculture. "Other" category probably includes the horse racing industry

Strong representation amongst trades and managers

Very high proportion of the population work at home.

Very large growth in number of cars.

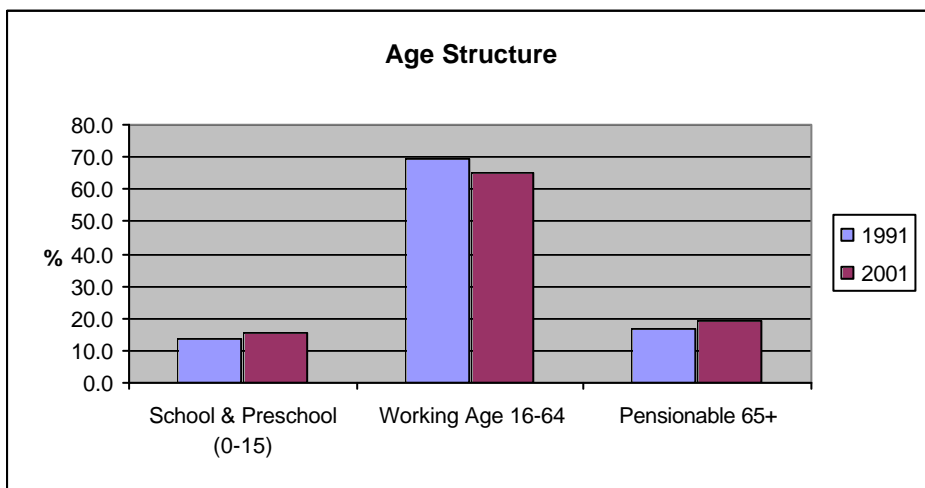
