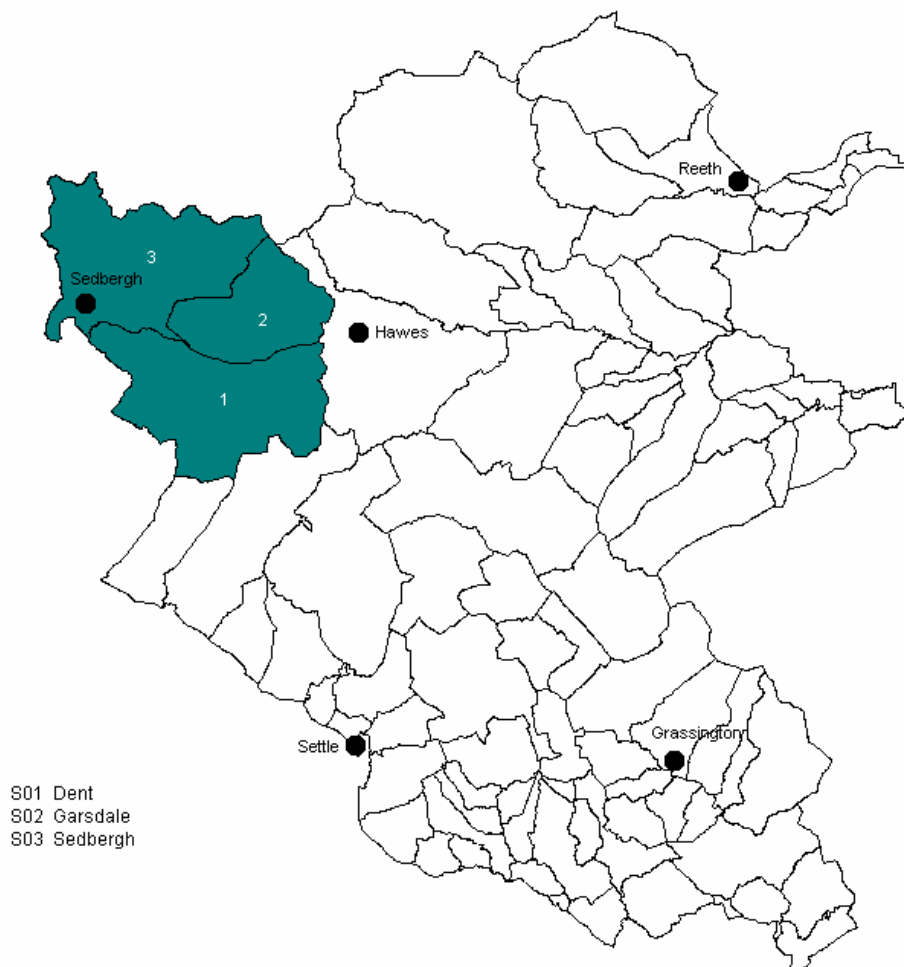




SOUTH LAKELAND (in YDNP) CENSUS PROFILE 1991-2001

(Parishes of Dent, Sedbergh and Garsdale)

Dent includes Middleton parish which is outside the NP).*



Notes

1. Figures may not sum due to independent rounding and adjustments to preserve confidentiality.
2. Any parish that falls below the confidentiality threshold for Small Area Statistics data is merged with a contiguous parish. (Confidentiality threshold in 1991 was 50 persons/20 households, in 2001 the threshold was 100 persons/40 households.)
3. Where parishes are split by the National Park boundary and/or combined with others outside the boundary, an estimate has been made of the percentage in the Park.

Summary

Highest population growth in the National Park (predominantly in Sedbergh)
(2001 figures do not include boarding students)

Significant growth in the number of children.

This is supported by a growth in the number of people of working age.

Note: only modest increase in the number of elderly people.

Slight decline in households with children, despite increase in number of children.

Large growth in single person and multi-adult households

200 more houses (mostly in Sedbergh). Increase in second home ownership (mostly within Sedbergh).

Significant increase in outright purchase.

Range of employment types is similar to National Park average, except for education which is strongly represented.

Fuller range of occupation types than National Park average.

High proportion of population walk to work.

521 more cars

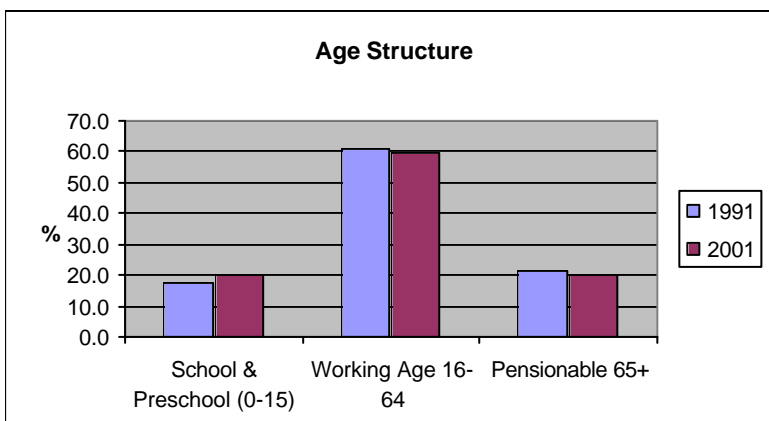
